



The English portrait-artist George Dawe (1781-1829) is best known for the 329 paintings of Russian generals active during the Napoleonic invasion of Russia he created for the Military Gallery of the Winter Palace. Dawe originally trained as an engraver following the path of his father Philip who engraved in mezzotint and worked with Hogarth. He later became interested mainly in painting and went to study at the Royal Academy, first exhibiting in 1804. He was elected an Associate Member of the Academy in 1809 and became an Academician in 1814. His paintings of classical subjects garnered him much praise, but he gravitated to the more financially remunerative portraiture commissions. In this sphere, he enjoyed the patronage of the Duke and Duchess of Kent, and also that of Princess Charlotte and Prince Leopold.

While traveling through Europe with the Duke of Kent in 1819, his paintings of military staff and diplomats brought him to the attention of Tsar Alexander I, who commissioned Dawe to paint the portraits of his senior military staff that had successfully fought Napoleon. Dawe relocated to St. Petersburg and from 1822 to 1828, along with his assistants Alexander Polyakov and Wilhelm August Golicke, painted over 300 portraits for the Winter Palace. The Arts establishment in Russia widely praised him, while Pushkin lauded him in a poem. In 1826, Dawe was invited to the coronation of Nicholas I and in 1828 was officially appointed First Portrait Painter of the Imperial Court. But following a brief return to England, he took ill and died in October 1829 at the home of his brother-in-law and fellow painter, Thomas Wright. He is buried at St. Paul's Cathedral.

Conceived in 1768, the Royal Academy of Arts gold medal recognizes exceptional achievements in the fields of architecture, painting and art. Dawe received his medal for "Achilles, Frantic for the Loss of Patroclus, Rejecting the Consolation of Thetis" which was regarded by his contemporaries as "the best ever offered to the Academy on a similar occasion". The painting today is housed today in the Museum of New Zealand Te Papa Tongarewa, Wellington.

Ажордж Доу родился 8 февраля 1781 года в приходе Сент-Джеймс, его родители Филипп и Джейн Доу. Филипп Доу был художником и гравером в мецио-тинто, работал вместе с Хогартом и Тёрнером, также писал политические карикатуры о жизни в Америке. Джордж был старшим ребёнком в семье.

Первоначально Джордж тренировался с отцом, как гравер, но позднее он заинтересовался живописью и отправился на учёбу в Королевскую Академию художеств. В 1809 году Доу стал членом Академии художеств, а в 1814 году - академиком. Позднее он стал одним из самых успешных художников своего поколения, приобретя широкую известность.

Он пользовался покровительством герцога и герцогини Кентских. В 1819 году отправился вместе с герцогом Кентским в путешествие по Европе, в ходе которого привлёк внимание Александра I. Император заказал художнику портреты русских генералов, участвовавших в войне с Наполеоном I.

В 1826 году Николай I пригласил Доу на свою коронацию, а в 1828 году Джордж был официально назначен Первым художником IИмператорского двора.

В 1828 году он вернулся в Англию, где оставался в течение нескольких месяцев. В 1829 году Доу вернулся в Санкт-Петербург, но вскоре у него усиливаются проблемы с дыханием. У Джорджа была лёгочная недостаточность на протяжении всей жизни из-за перенесённой в детстве болезни. В августе 1829 Доу вернулся в Лондон, и 15 октября он скончался.

Джордж Доу был похоронен в крипте собора святого Павла. На похоронах присутствовало множество художников и представителей российского посольства.





Thus the host coin here is 1 gram light – its surfaces may possibly have been mechanically smoothed in order to receive the unusual design of the pattern. As to why a Soviet coin (or any coin for that matter) would be used as a host on which to strike this Polish pattern, this is an enigma. A possible explanation may lie in the designer Stanislaw Szukalski, one of Poland's most controversial artists, whose goal was to create a new Polish art based on its mythology and history. Graduated from military engineer's school in 1922, and commander improvement courses in 1932. During WWII, distinguished himself in commanding critically important engineering works for Leningrad's "Road of Life", strategic crossings of Neva, Visla, Dnestr and Dnepr Rivers. During crossing of Visla River in August 3-5 1944, his regiment built a bridge and managed to transfer tanks and ammunitions across to the enemy's side, followed by two days of successfully repelling all the counter attacks. By decree of Sept. 23, 1944, "For outstanding leadership and skillful command of his pontoon-engineering regiment during crossing of Visla River and personal bravery" he was bestowed with the title of Hero of the Soviet Union, with GOLD HSU Star #1992 and Order of Lenin #10986.

After the war, continued to serve in the Soviet Army. Retired in 1954. Died on December 20, 1980.

Николай Соколов родился 23 апреля 1899 года в селе Акшуат (ныне — Барышский район Ульяновской области). Получил среднее образование. Окончил Симбирскую чувашскую учительскую семинарию (1919). В 1919 году Соколов был призван на службу в Рабоче-крестьянскую Красную Армию. Участвовал в боях Гражданской войны. В 1922 году Соколов окончил военно-инженерные курсы в Самаре, в 1932 году — курсы усовершенствования командного состава. С января 1943 года — на фронтах Великой Отечественной войны, командовал 3-й понтонно-мостовой бригадой. Под его руководством она переправляла советские войска через Неву, Днепр, Случь, Горынь и Днестр, строила «дорогу жизни» под Ленинградом. Бригада Соколова особо отличилась во время форсирования Вислы. В период с 3 по 5 августа 1944 года части бригады построили наплавной мост, переправив танки, топливо и боеприпасы через реку. Когда немецкие войска попытались захватить переправу, бойцы бригады в течение двух суток отражали их атаки, удержав её.

Указом Президиума Верховного Совета СССР от 23 сентября 1944 года за «умелое руководство действиями понтонно-мостовой бригады при наведении переправы для танковой армии через Вислу и проявленные при этом личное мужество и героизм» полковник Николай Соколов был удостоен высокого звания Героя Советского Союза с вручением ордена Ленина и медали «Золотая Звезда» за номером 1992.

После окончания войны Соколов продолжил службу в Советской Армии. В 1954 году в звании генерал-майора он был уволен в запас. Проживал в Киеве. Умер 20 декабря 1980 года, похоронен на Лукьяновском военном кладбище Киева.

Started service in 1937, but by 1939 managed to graduate military infantry school and received his first assignment as a machine-gun platoon commander. During WWII, distinguished himself in fighting at Stalingrad and 2nd Ukrainian fronts. During crossing of Dnestr River in 1944, his regiment was among the first to reach the enemy's side, and successfully repel all the counter-offensive attempts, destroying 3 tanks, 60 vehicles and taking 150 POW's in the process. By decree of Sept. 13, 1944, "For outstanding leadership and skillful command of his regiment during crossing of Dnestr" he was bestowed with the title of Hero of the Soviet Union, with GOLD HSU Star #2279 and Order of Lenin #20928.

After the war, graduated from famous Military Academy of General Staff. From 1968-1974 was serving in command of 38th Army. Retired in 1980. Died on May 28, 1996.

Павел Семёнович Билаонов (17 октября 1919 — 28 мая 1996) — советский офицер и военачальник, Герой Советского Союза, генерал-лейтенант (21.02.1969).

В годы Великой Отечественной войны командир 681-го стрелкового полка 133-й стрелковой дивизии 40-й армии 2-го Украинского фронта, майор.

Родился 17 октября 1919 года в городе Дигоре (ныне Северная Осетия)[1] в семье служащего. Окончил среднюю школу в городе Орджоникидзе, работал бригадиром на заводе «Электроцинк».

В 1937 году призван в ряды Красной Армии. В 1939 году окончил Орджоникидзевское военное пехотное училище и был назначен командиром пулемётного взвода в городе Ейске.

В боях Великой Отечественной войны с апреля 1942 года. Воевал на Сталинградском, 2-м Украинском фронтах. Член КПСС с 1942 года.

Был активным участником Сталинградской битвы. В должности офицера штаба 293-й стрелковой дивизии участвовал в ожесточённых боях по прорыву вражеской обороны, освобождении хуторов Громки, Илларионовский. Затем во главе танкового десанта одним из первых ворвался в район хутора Платонов, станиц Голубинская, Верхняя Бузиновка. В том бою подразделение Билаонова уничтожило 300 и захватили в плен 1200 вражеских солдатов и офицеров, 17 орудий, 60 автомашин.

В начале декабря 1942 года Билаонов был назначен начальником штаба стрелкового полка, а затем командиром этого же полка. Во главе своего полка участвовал в боях с гитлеровцами в районе «Пяти курганов» — опорного пункта противника. Высота «Пять курганов» была очищена от гитлеровцев. Враг понес большие потери в живой силе и боевой технике. Билаонов был тяжело ранен, но поле боя не покинул, продолжал руководить наступлением своего полка до полного разгрома противника.

В ночь на 24 марта 1944 года майор Билаонов одним из первых в дивизии форсировал Днестр в районе села Липчаны Могилёв-Подольского района Винницкой области, овладел важными опорными пунктами обороны немцев. В течение суток полк уничтожил три танка, 60 автомашин с боеприпасами и вооружением, взял в плен 150 фашистов.

Указом Президиума Верховного Совета СССР от 13 сентября 1944 года за умелое командование полком при форсировании Днестра и удержании плацдарма на его правом берегу и проявленные при этом мужество и героизм майору Билаонову Павлу Семеновичу присвоено звание Героя Советского Союза с вручением ордена Ленина и медали «Золотая Звезда» (№ 2279).

В 1950 году окончил Военную академию имени М. В. Фрунзе, в 1961 году — Военную академию Генерального штаба и в 1969 году — Высшие академические курсы при ней. В 1971 году избран народным депутатом ВС УССР 8-го созыва. С октября 1968 по июнь 1974 года командовал 38-й армией в Прикарпатском военном округе.

С 1980 года генерал-лейтенант П. С. Билаонов — в отставке. Жил в Киеве. Умер 28 мая 1996 года. Похоронен в Киеве на Лукьяновском военном кладбище.

Not a lot is known about 1170th Regiment. According to documents and available sources, its' last WWII commander was Colonel Malahov. During the war, it was part of 197th Artillery "Lodzinsky" "Order of Suvorov" "Order of Kutuzov" Brigade, 1st Guards Tank Army, 1st Belorussian front. However, by some accounts, the Brigade was decommissioned in November, 1946, other accounts state that the Brigade was still listed as active in mid-1950's. No accounts have it as active beyond that. Extremely rare documented UNIT AWARD. Elusive in private hands.

Guards Master Sergeant Solov'ev Vasiliy Zaharovich started his service at the Far East Military District in 1933. Participated in WWII since August 1941, first as a radioman-machine gunner, later as medic, 45th Guards Tank Brigade. Responsible for saving a large number of wounded soldiers and officers on numerous battlefields. Very unusual and historically significant full cavalier group, with very rare Border reverse 2nd class order.

Приказом по 1-й танковой армии от 9 октября 1944 года гвардии старшина Соловьёв Василий Захарович награждён орденом Славы 2-й степени.

15-26 января 1945 года в районе города Слясин санинструктор старшина Соловьёв эвакуировал с поля боя 5 офицеров и 3 раненых автоматчиков с их личным оружием. В ночь на 26 января 1945 года Соловьёв, невзирая на ранение, под огнём противника вынес из горящего танка раненого командира орудия и переправил его в безопасное место.

Указом Президиума Верховного Совета СССР от 31 мая 1945 года за мужество, отвату и героизм гвардии старшина Соловьёв Василий Захарович награждён орденом Славы 1-й степени.

В 1945 году демобилизован. Жил в рабочем посёлке Красный Октябрь Каргапольского района Курганской области. Работал на Кособродской нефтебазе. Беспартийный.



Такого числа европейских стран всего за полгода войны не прошел ни один полководец Второй мировой войны, кроме бывшего питерского бухгалтера, крестьянского сына и русского офицера — Федора Толбухина.

Армейскую службу он начал в 1915 году. Летом 1916-го ему довелось участвовать в знаменитом Брусиловском прорыве.

В период между двумя войнами Толбухин продолжил военную карьеру. В 1938 году он стал начальником штаба Закавказского военного округа.

С марта 1943 года Толбухин командующий Южного фронта. Осенью 44-го за ряд крупных операций Толбухин получил Маршальскую Звезду.

Осенью 44-го были освобождены восточная часть Югославии и ее столица Белград. В ходе двух следующих операций — Будапештской и Балатонской — войска 3-го Украинского фронта совместно с войсками 2-го Украинского фронта отразили последнее крупное наступление вермахта во Второй мировой войне. Наконец, в ходе Венской операции весной 1945 года Красная Армия разгромила немецкую группу армий "Юг".

В Вене блистательный боевой путь полководца Толбухина был завершен. Он умер в 1949 году в возрасте 55 лет. Он не оставил мемуаров, поэтому часто его называют "забытый маршал". Однако его имя носят улицы, площади, проспекты в городах по всей Европе.

During World War II, Fyodor Ivanovich Tolbukhin (1894-1949) served as Chief of Staff for the Crimean Front, 1941-1942, Assistant Commander of the Stalingrad Military District, Commander of the 58th Army, Commander of the Southern Front and Commander of the 3rd Ukrainian Front. On September 12, 1944 he was promoted to Marshal of the Soviet Union. Widely respected by both his fellow commanders and his men, Tolbukhin is considered one the finest Soviet generals of World War II. Under his command, Bucharest, Sofia and Belgrade were liberated, while he took part in the liberation of Hungary and Austria. Decorated many times for bravery, Tolbukhin was the recipient of the Victory Order and Hero of the Soviet Union. After the war, he served as Commander-in-Chief of the Southern Group of Forces, which comprised the Balkan region. From January 1947 to his death, Tolbukhin was the commander of the Transcaucasus Military District.

By bidding at the Auction, whether in person, by agent, Commission Bid, telephone or other means, the Buyer shall be deemed to have consented to the exclusive jurisdiction of the state courts of, and the federal courts sitting in, the State of New York.

11. INTERPRETATION

11.1. In these Conditions:

'Auction Agent', 'Auctioneer', 'us' or 'we' means Ira & Larry Goldberg Coins & Collectibles Inc., Dmitry Markov Coins & Medals, M&M Numismatics Ltd., and Sovereign Rarities Ltd.;

'Bidder' and 'you' means a person making, attempting to make or considering making a bid for a Lot including a Buyer;

'Buyer' means the person who makes the highest bid for a Lot which is accepted by the auctioneer and if the person is acting as an agent, will be a reference to its principal only if Auction Agent has accepted the agency in writing;

'Catalog' means a catalog, price list or other publication or price list;

'Commission Bid' is an instruction from a Bidder to us to bid on their behalf at the Auction;

'Conditions' means these conditions of sale and any other additional terms notified to Bidders in writing in a Catalog or otherwise (which includes notices displayed at the Auction) or as agreed in writing between Auction Agent and the Bidder;

'Hammer Price' means the amount of the highest bid for a Lot accepted by the auctioneer;

'Including' or 'include' mean including without limitation and include without limitation, respectively:

'Lot' means any item deposited with us for sale at auction including items described against any Lot number in a Catalog;

'Purchase Price' means the Hammer Price plus Buyer's Premium and New York sales tax, where applicable;

'Reserve' means a confidential price below which the Auctioneer will not sell a Lot or will re-purchase on behalf of the Seller or for the account of Auctioneer. Unless otherwise specified at the time of Lot consignment, this will be set at approximately 80% of the Lot estimate at complete discretion of the auctioneer;

'Seller's Conditions' means the terms and conditions of sale between Auction Agent and a Seller for the sale of a Lot as displayed in the Auction room, on our website or available from Auction Agent.
